Subj: WINTER UNIFORM

1. Purpose. To publish the winter uniform period for the Naval Academy; Naval Support Activity Annapolis; and Naval Health Clinic, Annapolis effective 7 October 2013.

2. Cancellation. USNANOTE 1020 of 12 April 2013

3. Information. Uniforms prescribed apply only to U.S. Navy and Marine Corps personnel. Officers of other services and nations at the Naval Academy or under the area coordination of the Superintendent will wear the corresponding uniform of their service.

a. Basic uniform policy is published in references (a) and (b).

b. Uniforms for Midshipmen will be prescribed by the Commandant of Midshipmen.

c. Area Commanding Officers/Officers-in-Charge, not designated in paragraph 1 and not under the operational command of the Superintendent, United States Naval Academy, will prescribe uniforms for their personnel consistent with enclosures (1) and (2).

4. Action

a. For the period beginning 7 October 2013, Navy personnel will wear winter uniforms as prescribed in enclosures (1) and (2). There will be no transition period.

b. For the period beginning 4 November 2013, Marine Corps personnel will transition to the winter uniform as prescribed in enclosures (1) and (2). For any special occasions between 7 October and 4 November 2013 (i.e. Athletic events, Special Occasions, etc.) in which the Navy is in Service Dress Blue, the Marines in attendance shall be in Service "A" with service cap for that event.

Leave and Liberty: Appropriate civilian attire is authorized in lieu of the Uniform of the Day. Personnel will ensure their dress and personal appearance is appropriate and will not bring discredit upon the Naval service.

**Notes:**

1. Appropriate working uniforms may be authorized by Commanding Officers, Officers-in-Charge, and the Commandant of Midshipmen. Officers normally dealing with Midshipmen will wear the Uniform of the Day or Alternate Uniform of the Day. Should circumstances such as academic labs, YP drills, etc., make the Working Uniform necessary, it is authorized at the Department Head's discretion to be worn only while involved in a specific work assignment.

2. The Navy black V-neck pullover (both light and heavy weaves in accordance with article 3501.83 and footnote 4 reference (a)) and the Marine Corps (green or blue) Service Sweater (with or without Epaulettes) are authorized for wear by officers of the respective services. The Navy black jacket with stand-up knit collar may be worn in lieu of Service Dress Blue (SDB) blouse with or without the sweater. Brown pullover sweaters are not authorized. The gender neutral (men's style) Navy blue garrison cap may be

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worn with the sweater or jacket (not with the SDB blouse), Midshipmen do not have corresponding options. Navy officers will wear the SDB blouse when attending events where Midshipmen are required to wear SDB. Officers of the other services stationed at the Academy will adjust their uniform guidance as appropriate. The Marine Corps Tanker Jacket is an optional uniform article that can be worn with the Service "B" or Blue Dress "C" uniform.

3. Navy and Marine women may wear skirts as an option to the basic uniform. Service shoes or pumps may be worn with either skirts or slacks for Navy personnel.

4. A V-neck or Crew-neck undershirt will be worn with Service Khaki Uniform.

5. On the Naval Academy grounds, Working Uniforms are authorized in work areas and while involved in work detail only. This policy generally precludes the wearing of Working Uniforms, in the central ceremonial area of the Naval Academy and in areas normally frequented by tourists. The ceremonial area is defined as that portion of the Yard bounded by Bancroft, Chauvenet, Michelson, Maury, Sampson, and Preble Halls, the Administration Building, Chapel, Buchanan House, and Dahlgren Hall.

6. The brown leather flight jacket is authorized to be worn on the Naval Academy complex by Navy (in accordance with article 6803.2.b(2) reference (a)) or Marine Corps personnel. The brown leather flight jacket may be worn with the Service Khaki (Navy) and Service "B" (Marine) only; it will not be worn in lieu of the SDB blouse (Navy). *The brown leather flight jacket must not be torn or worn but present a very professional and military appearance. Patches on the flight jacket will be limited to no more than one patch on each front lapel and each shoulder; patches on the back of the jacket are not allowed.* The green nylon flight jacket is not authorized to be worn on the Naval Academy Complex.

7. Appropriate civilian attire is authorized for Chapel services and athletic events for all officers at their option. Service Khaki/Uniform of the day for Marines is authorized for non-football sporting events.

8. Blue Dress "A" for Company Grade Officers only.

9. The Marine Corps All Weather Coat may be worn or prescribed for wear with the service and dress uniforms. It may be worn with or without the liner at individual's option.

10. An optional nine inch rough side out leather safety boot (steel toed) may be worn with the Navy Working Uniform while ashore.

11. Marine Corps Uniforms will not necessarily be equivalent to the Navy Uniform for the same event. All changes to the prescribed uniforms will be announced ahead of time to ensure uniformity. At all times MCO P1020.34G shall be followed.

**Leave and Liberty:** Appropriate civilian attire is authorized in lieu of the Uniform of the Day. Personnel will ensure their dress and personal appearance are appropriate and will not bring discredit upon the Naval service.

**Notes:**

1. The Navy black V-neck pullover (both light and heavy weaves in accordance with article 3501.83 and footnote 4 reference (a)) and the Marine Corps (green or blue) Service Sweater (with or without Epaulettes) are authorized for wear by E-7 & above of the respective services. The Navy black jacket with stand-up knit collar may be worn in lieu of Service Dress Blue (SDB) blouse with or without the sweater. The gender neutral (men's style) Navy blue garrison cap may be worn with the sweater or jacket (NOT with the SDB blouse). Midshipmen do not have corresponding options. Navy CPO's will wear the SDB blouse when attending events where Midshipmen are required to wear SDB. Sweater or jacket option is authorized for wear off base in public places. For Marines: The Marine Corps Tanker Jacket is an optional uniform article that can be worn with Service "B" or Blue Dress "C" uniforms. The Tanker Jacket may be worn with the Service Sweater. The Tanker Jacket will not be worn with the MARPAT Uniform.

2. Navy and Marine women may wear skirts as an option to the basic uniform. Service shoes or pumps may be worn with either skirts or slacks for Navy personnel.

3. Working Khaki and Navy Working Uniform may be worn to and from work by all personnel. Clean working uniforms are authorized for wear at the Navy Exchange/Commissary Complex and to and from the Medical and Dental Clinics.

4. On the Naval Academy grounds, Working Uniforms are authorized in work areas and while involved in work detail only. This policy generally precludes the wearing of Working Uniforms, in the central ceremonial area of the Naval Academy and in areas normally frequented by tourists. The ceremonial area is defined as that portion of the Yard bounded by Bancroft, Chauvenet, Michelson, Maury, Sampson, and Preble Halls, the Administration Building, Chapel, Buchanan House, and Dahlgren Hall.

5. Navy V-neck black pullover sweater is authorized for wear at all times. Black cardigan sweater is authorized within immediate office space only. Brown pullover sweaters are not authorized under any circumstances. Brown leather flight jackets are authorized to be worn on the Academy Complex (in accordance with article 6803.2.b.(2) reference (a)). The brown leather flight jacket may be worn with the Service Khaki (Navy) and Service "B" (Marine) only; it will not be worn in lieu of the SDB blouse (Navy). The brown leather flight jacket must not be torn or worn but present a very professional and military appearance.

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Patches on the flight jacket will be limited to no more than one patch on each front lapel and each shoulder; patches on the back of the jacket are not allowed. The green nylon flight jacket is not authorized to be worn on the Naval Academy Complex.

6. Appropriate working uniforms may be authorized by Commanding Officers, Officers-in-Charge, and the Commandant of Midshipmen. Individuals normally dealing with Midshipmen will wear the Uniform of the Day or Alternate Uniform of the Day. Should circumstance such as academic labs, YP drills, etc., make the Working Uniform necessary, it is authorized at the Department Head's discretion to be worn only while involved in a specific work assignment.

7. Appropriate civilian attire is authorized for Chapel services and athletic events for all personnel at their option. Service Khaki/Uniform of the day for Marines is authorized for non-football sporting events.

8. The Marine Corps All Weather Coat may be worn or prescribed for wear with the service and dress uniforms. It may be worn with or without the liner at individual's option.

9. A V-neck or Crew-neck undershirt will be worn with Service Khaki Uniform.

10. An optional nine inch rough side out leather safety boot (steel toed) may be worn with the Navy Working Uniform while ashore.

11. Marine Corps Uniforms will not necessarily be equivalent to the Navy Uniforms for the same event. All changes to the prescribed uniform will be announced ahead of time to ensure uniformity. MCO P1020.34G shall be followed at all times.
