Subj: NAVAL ACADEMY PROGRAM IN CREATIVE AND FINE ARTS

1. Purpose. To establish committee guidance for the general administration of the Naval Academy Program in Creative and Fine Arts.

2. Cancellation. USNAINST 5420.23C

3. Background

a. The Naval Academy Program in Creative and Fine Arts was established by Mrs. Eliot H. Bryant in memory of the late Vice Admiral Eliot H. Bryant to sponsor programs in the creative and performing arts including plays, concerts, art exhibits, and other related events. The program is for the benefit of midshipmen, faculty, and staff of the Naval Academy and active duty and retired military families in the Annapolis area.

b. The policies established herein support Goal Number 1 of the Strategic Plan, which is "to provide every midshipman with a total quality education."

c. This update of the instruction brings the program into compliance with the Federal Advisory Committee Act. (A)

4. Discussion. Costs of creative arts productions are subsidized by gifts from the Eliot H. Bryant Memorial Fund managed by the Naval Academy Alumni Association; the Midshipmen Welfare Fund managed by the Commandant of Midshipmen; and are also offset by ticket sales. Tickets for midshipmen are normally at a reduced price. Events are scheduled subject to available scheduling dates, cost, and nature of the event. The Committee for the Program in Creative and Fine Arts is responsible for scheduling events. (R)

5. Action

a. The Committee will handle all aspects of these programs. The Committee consists of the following: (R)

Chairperson - Deputy for Management
Deputy Chairperson - Director of Musical Activities, Commandant of Midshipmen
Member - Brigade Operations Officer
Member - Public Affairs Officer
Member - Secretary, Deputy for Management
Member - Deputy Brigade Commander or representative
MEMBER - DIRECTOR OF MASQUERADES

b. The Committee will:

(1) Meet on the first Tuesday of every third month beginning with January each year.

(2) Review annually in April the Naval Academy Creative and Fine Arts Programs and provide recommendations to the Superintendent on program scopes, foci, goals, and contents.

(3) Submit to the Superintendent program needs which will be included in the "Needs List" given to the Naval Academy Alumni Association at its request. (A)

(4) Monitor the maintenance and decor of the Eliot H. Bryant Room in Alumni Hall.

(5) Submit current list of Committee members to the Superintendent, annually in October.

c. The Director of Musical Activities is responsible for the selection of creative arts programs.
