Subj: FRANK M. ADAMS JUNIOR OFFICER LEADERSHIP AWARD

Encl: (1) Format for Statement of Qualifications of Nominees

1. Purpose. To promulgate selection procedures for the nomination process of the Frank M. Adams Junior Officer Leadership award.

2. Background. The Commandant of Midshipmen has a special interest in ensuring the Brigade of Midshipmen is exposed to the highest quality of leadership exhibited by the junior officers assigned to his/her staff. A memorial fund in honor of Captain Frank M. Adams, USN (Ret), Class of 1947, was established to support an annual award to be presented to the junior officer who, by personal example and professional performance, best characterizes the principles of excellence in leadership. This fund is managed by the Alumni Association.

3. Cancellation. COMDTMIDNINST 1620.2A

4. Description

a. The Frank M. Adams Junior Officer Leadership Award is bestowed annually upon that junior officer selected from the Commandant's staff whose contributions to the leadership, professional and moral development of midshipmen reflect the highest principles of excellence in professionalism and leadership development.

b. The award consists of a mounted ship's bell clock or suitable equivalent and a plate on which the recipient's name is inscribed. All nominees receive a letter of commendation from the Commandant of Midshipmen.

5. Eligibility

a. Any military officer, O-3 and below, who has served for more than 12 months is eligible for nomination.

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b. Individuals who receive the award are not eligible for subsequent participation.

6. Action

a. Deputy Commandant of Midshipmen, Director of Officer Development, Director of Professional Development, Senior Chaplain, Supply officer, Commandant Operations Officer, and Battalion Officers comprise the Award Selection Committee and will:

(1) Ensure military members of the staff are aware of this award.

(2) Use enclosure (1) for the selection of their department's nominee for the award. Review the departmental nominees and establish a priority listing. Submit this listing to the Commandant's Administrative Officer, along with a statement of qualifications of each nominee by the second week of April each year.


b. The Award Selection Committee will:

(1) Review the qualifications of the nominees and establish a priority listing, recommending the recipient of the award.

(2) Submit the priority listing to the Commandant of Midshipmen for his/her review by the third week of April of each awarding year.

c. The Commandant of Midshipmen will review the recommendation of the Award Selection Committee and select the award recipient by May 1<sup>st</sup> of each year.

d. The Deputy Commandant will provide the Alumni Association the name of the Officer selected for the Captain Frank M. Adams Junior Officer Leadership Award. The Alumni Association will purchase the ship's bell clock to be presented. Presentation of the award will be part of the Dedication Ceremony at the beginning of Commissioning Week.
