

# 2008-09 Navy Hockey

## Season Outlook

### Navy Hockey 2008-2009 Outlook

Coming off back-to-back 20 win seasons, the Midshipmen of Navy look to continue their winning ways in what is expected to be a breakout year for the Navy Hockey program. In a year of firsts under first year Head Coach Mike Fox, last year's team christened the magnificent new Dr. John J. McMullen Hockey Arena and nearly knocked off perennial American Collegiate Hockey Association (ACHA) powerhouse Penn State at home in a thrilling 3-2 loss in the first round of the Eastern States Collegiate Hockey League (ESCHL) Playoffs. It was also Navy Hockey's first year in the newly formed ESCHL, the ACHA's premier Division 1 league in the east. This year's team looks to build on the experiences of last season, challenging for the top spot in the ESCHL, while looking to gain national recognition as one of the top D1 college hockey clubs in the country.

This year the Midshipmen will be more comfortable at home in the Brigade Sports Complex, skating on the Olympic-size rink that meets NCAA standards. The arena currently has a seating capacity for 800 spectators but has the capacity to expand to more than 3,000 seats. Named in honor of the late Dr. John J. McMullen, a Naval Academy Distinguished Graduate from the class of 1940, and his wife Jacqueline, Navy's new rink is the envy of many NCAA and ACHA hockey programs throughout the country.

### The Schedule

Navy Hockey's 39th year as a Club Sport at the Naval Academy is highlighted by an aggressive 40 game regular season schedule against many of the very best ACHA D1 teams. In addition to playing 4 games against each league opponent in the ESCHL, which includes Penn State, University of Rhode Island, University of



Delaware, and Drexel University, this year Navy hosts Iowa State, West Chester University, and Washington and Jefferson College in the Naval Academy Thanksgiving Weekend Tournament. The team also travels to Ohio to play Kent State and John Carroll University, two top Midwestern ACHA teams, and plays two games apiece against Michigan-Dearborn, Pitt, and Central Oklahoma at home. Once again, the always popular Crabpot Tournament at McMullen Arena will consist of four teams from Maryland - Navy, University of Maryland, UMBC, and Towson University.

The quality of this year's schedule positions the Midshipmen for a strong run at significant postseason play. With at least 25 games scheduled against ranked D1 teams this season, Navy has one of the toughest schedules of the 53 ACHA D1 schools.

In April, as an extra bonus, Navy Hockey will be involved in several activities associated with the Frozen Four, when the Naval Academy and the Greater Washington Sports Alliance host the 2009 NCAA Division 1 National Championship at the Verizon Center in Washington, D.C.

### Returning Players

This year's senior class has endured a period of transition for the Navy Hockey program. Not only were the "Firsties" the last class to play on the Yard in the historic Dahlgren Hall Ice Rink, they also played a full season without a home sheet of ice while the new rink was being built. As juniors, they were involved in Navy's move to the ESCHL, and began playing their home games in McMullen Ice Arena when it was unveiled at the beginning of last season.

This senior class is one of the largest in recent memory, with nine players returning for their final year. The team is led by dominant ACHA players Matt Swezey, Charlie Daniel and Alex Wallis.

These three seniors produced 46 goals and 62 assists last season and are looking to provide even more offense this year. Jack Culliton and Jeff Martin will also be counted on to provide a consistent scoring threat. Matt Keller and Eric Bowen are back after their first season with Navy Hockey and provide key leadership for the team on and off the ice. Also returning for their Senior year are Jon Westerman, Jeff Martin, and Jeff Dubinsky. "Westy" is a key face-off man with a knack for scoring big-time goals, while 'Marty' is a strong, smart Minnesotan with great skills and hockey sense. Jeff Dubinsky is a solid forechecking forward known for his tight defensive play and energy.

No discussion of the "Firsties" would be complete without mentioning Nolan Anliker. Unfortunately, Nolan was not granted a medical redshirt year by the ACHA, losing a year of eligibility at Navy as a result of playing an injury riddled season at Bethel College (NCAA D3) before becoming a Midshipman. Nolan was a tremendous on-ice asset to the program. He was a three year letter winner at Navy and was awarded the Navy Hockey Leadership Award last season as a junior. Although his presence on the ice will be missed during his senior year, he will remain a key leader of this year's team as the President of the Navy Hockey Club.

Complementing the large senior class are junior forwards Keegan Kinkade and Calen Mims, both high quality, two-way hockey players. Forwards Zak Bishop, Sam Carlson, Stevie Csutoros, Justin Jackson, Michael Orzetti, and Jake Stevens-Haas return for their second season with the program and add considerable depth to this year's Navy Hockey squad.

Defensively, Patrick Heitman, Andrew Ochalek, and Chandler Brewer will backstop this year's team. These three strong skating juniors will be vital to the team's success. They will be supported by talented sophomore defenseman, Jonathan Wheeler.

Between the pipes, Navy has two high quality and experienced junior goaltenders in Eric Anderson and Jeremy Estevez. Junior goalie Alex Tidei returns for another year and will also compete for playing minutes.

## The Newcomers

Steady defensemen Derek Grady and Andy Lazzaro join this year's team for the first time as juniors. After sitting out a year to retain eligibility, sophomore Matt Roberts will also help cement this year's outstanding defensive corps.

In addition to adding three new upperclassmen, this year Navy Hockey is proud to have assembled one of its most impressive Plebe classes ever. The Class of 2012 features 8 young men with exceptional hockey skills. These newcomers played for highly regarded

high school, prep school, and junior hockey programs last year and include free wheeling forwards Thomas Fick (Marine, MN) and Mitch Pulver (Chippewa Falls, WI). On defense, Gary Beier (Arnold, MD) is also a very welcome addition to this year's squad and Jameson Marshall (Barrington, RI) is a very impressive freshman goaltender who could see considerable playing time in net this season. Other freshmen rounding out this talented group of players include forward Kevin Frederick (Minneapolis, MN), forward Jim Tumolo (Turnersville, NJ), defenseman Pat McAleer (Orono, Maine) and defenseman Scott Mecham (Salt Lake City, UT).

## The Excitement

Navy Hockey's total commitment to victory, aggressiveness, and selfless style of team play will certainly thrill the packed-house at McMullen Arena during the 2008-2009 campaign. The Midshipmen's unrelenting and coordinated system of offense, defense, and neutral zone play will make the team competitive in every game right down to the final buzzer. As Navy contends for an ESCHL Championship and bids for its first ACHA National Championship, Navy Hockey fans will enjoy watching the intense, hard-hitting, fast-paced action on the brilliant Olympic-size ice surface at McMullen Area. The players appreciate your enthusiastic support and thank you for cheering them on to victory!

## Mike Fox, Head Coach

Coach Fox enters his second year at the helm of the United States Naval Academy Men's Hockey Team. In his rookie year, he led a team of returning but inexperienced Navy Hockey players to consecutive 20-game wins for the first time ever. Coach Fox's "TEAM" approach and lack of fear for taking on top ranked teams has enabled Navy Hockey to contend at a national level. The success of last year's team leaves the club poised for a strong national standing during the 2008-2009 season.

After only one year as Head Coach, Coach Fox was selected as one of eight coaches from across the country to coach at the World University Games tryout camp and assist in the selection of Team USA for the February 2009 games. He attributes his selection to his team's tremendous success last year but it comes as no surprise to Navy Hockey. The team sees his daily desire to teach his players, his focus on "team-first", and his determination to elevate hockey at the United States Naval Academy to the highest collegiate levels possible, as the reasons for his prestigious selection.

Given his background, it is not surprise that Coach Fox emphasizes the development of skills for team success. Coach Fox began skating on the frozen ponds of Minnesota at age three and played his first organized hockey in one of the nation's first and finest youth hockey programs, the Edina Hockey Association. Between high school and college, he played for the Lancer's Team in the Olympic Development League and went on to become a four-year letterman for the Ohio University Bobcats, playing in the NCAA Division 1 CCHA League. Upon graduation, he was invited to the camp of the WHA's Minnesota Fighting Saints and played three years for the Saint Cloud Saints

before becoming a Pee Wee coach in the Edina Hockey Association.

Coach Fox has a passion for the game that he loves to share. He has coached Squirt and Midget All-Star Select teams in Chicago, and a junior team in Fort Worth, Texas that was a State Champion and the Southwest Region runner-up. In addition, he has worked at hockey camps throughout the country with several very highly regarded hockey coaches, including Doug Woog and Dave Peterson.

When the Fox's moved to Annapolis, Coach Fox continued his passion for the game by teaching skating lessons to children and power skating skills to local young players. With Lisa, his dedicated wife, the Fox's built the Navy Youth Hockey program into a strong and growing organization. Initially starting with about 30 players, they grew the program to over 180 before handing over the reigns. Today, Navy Youth Hockey has over 250 players and the program continues to be founded on a philosophy of emphasizing skills and developing team work.

He and Lisa are very proud of their two children. Brittany, in her first year of Physicians Assistant School, graduated from the University of Notre Dame where she played NCAA Division I Lacrosse on a team that went to the NCAA Final Four. Christopher graduated from Culver Military Academy last year where he played hockey and captained the State Champion lacrosse team. He is currently a student at Ohio University and a member of the Air Force ROTC.

Mike is currently a corporate pilot and instructor flying the Gulfstream 450 and 550. He and his wife of 18 years and two children live in Calvert County Maryland.




## Brendan Curley, *Assistant Coach*

# Midshipman Named to TEAM USA

In a season full of firsts, Navy Hockey is pleased to announce the selection of Midshipman First Class Matt Swezey to represent the United States and TEAM USA at the upcoming Winter World University Games in Harbin, China from February 18-28, 2009. A native of Cohoes, New York, Matt Swezey is the first hockey player from the United States Naval Academy to be selected to TEAM USA.

Matt started playing ice hockey when he was four years old for the Capital Youth Hockey in the Albany, New York area. As a Squirt at age 12, his team won the New York State Championship. Matt then went to Shaker High School in Latham, New York, where he played varsity hockey for all four years. The team won the Section II Championship during his freshman year. For his senior year, he was selected as Captain of the team, and his team won the Suburban Council Championship and the New York State Regional Qualifier. Matt was selected First Team All-Section and 2nd Team All-State. He was also recognized as an Albany Times Union Scholar Athlete and a member of Shaker High's National Honor Society.

The son of a 1980 graduate of the United States Military Academy at West Point, Midshipman Swezey chose the Naval Academy during an unplanned stop by his family during the spring break of his sophomore year of high school. While they were passing through the area, his family decided to see Annapolis for the first time. After Matt listened to the presentation at the Admission's Office, he was hooked and Navy

was his first choice even though Army was recruiting him to play Division 1 lacrosse.

Every day, the United States Naval Academy strives to accomplish its mission to develop midshipmen "morally, mentally, and physically." Midshipman Matt Swezey is the personification of this mission.

Matt has achieved a 3.72 cumulative GPA in his Mechanical Engineering Major and a 3.58 Military GPA. He is currently on the Superintendent's List and has been on an Academic Honor Roll in each of his six prior semesters.



Matt Swezey has been the embodiment of the growth of Navy Hockey. He was an immediate presence on Navy's defensive corps as a plebe because of his size, puck handling skills, and slap shot. After two and a half seasons of playing defense, he was moved to the forward position in order to fill a void. Even though he had never played forward in any type of organized hockey, he rose to the challenge and netted 24 goals in only 18 games. At the end of the season the accolades began to pour in. He was named Team MVP at the annual team banquet and finished the season as both the leading scorer and the leading goal scorer. He was named an Academic All-American and was selected to the ESCHL 2nd-Team All-League.

Matt will proudly represent both the United States Navy and the United States at the 2009 World University Games.

Navy Hockey salutes NASA Astronaut Stephen Bowen (Captain, USN) who is scheduled to fly into space aboard the space shuttle Endeavour in November 2008. Captain Bowen graduated from Cohasset High School, Cohasset, Massachusetts in 1982 and was a standout goaltender for the Navy Hockey team from 1982-1986.

Bowen graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1986 with B.S. in Electrical Engineering and earned a Degree of Ocean Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1993. Bowen is the first Submarine Officer selected by NASA in July 2000 as a mission specialist.


Upon completion of the submarine training pipeline Bowen spent three years attached to USS PARCHE (SSN 683) and completed qualification in Submarines on USS POGY (SSN 647). After attending the MIT/WHOI Joint program in Ocean Engineering he reported to USS AUGUSTA (SSN 710) for duty as the Engineering Officer. During this tour he qualified for command of nuclear powered submarines. In 1997 he reported to the United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) in the Office of Plans and Policy and worked on the USSOCOM Future Concepts Working Group. For 9 months in 1999 he was the Reactor and Propulsion inspector for the Navy's Submarine Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV). In May 2000 he became the first Executive Officer of the Pre-Commissioning Unit VIRGINIA (SSN 774) the first of the new VIRGINIA Class submarines.

Captain Bowen reported for training at the Johnson Space Center in August 2000. Following the completion of two years of training and evaluation, he was initially assigned technical duties in the Astronaut Office Station Operations Branch. Bowen is assigned to the crew of STS-126 targeted for launch in November, 2008. Endeavour will carry a reusable logistics module that will hold supplies and equipment, including additional crew quarters, a second treadmill, equipment for the regenerative life support system and spare hardware for the International Space Station.
