## Swezey Selected to TEAM USA

In a season full of firsts, Navy Hockey announced the selection of Midshipman First Class Matt Swezey to represent the United States and TEAM USA at the upcoming Winter World University Games in Harbin, China

from February 18-28, 2009. A native of Cohoes, New York, Matt Swezey is the first

hockey player from the United States Naval Academy to be selected to TEAM USA.

Matt started playing ice hockey when he was four years old for the Capital Youth Hockey in the

(cont'd from page 1) Albany, New York area. As a Squirt at age 12, his team won the New York State Championship. Matt then went to Shaker High School in Latham, New York, where he played varsity hockey for all four years. The team won the Section II Championship during his freshman year. In his senior year, he was selected as Captain of the team, and his team won the Suburban Council Championship and the New York State Regional Qualifier. Matt was selected First Team All-Section, 2nd Team All-State, recognized as an Albany Times Union Scholar Athlete and was a member of Shaker High's National Honor Society.

The son of a [1980](#) graduate of the United States Military Academy, Midshipman Swezey chose the Naval Academy during an unplanned stop in Annapolis by his family during the spring break of his high school sophomore year. After Matt listened to the presentation at the Admission's Office, he

was hooked and Navy was his first choice even though Army was recruiting him to play Division I lacrosse.

Every day, the United States Naval Academy strives to accomplish its mission to develop midshipmen "morally, mentally, and physically." Midshipman Matt Swezey is the personification of this mission.

Matt has achieved a 3.72 cumulative GPA in his Mechanical Engineering Major and a 3.58 Military GPA. He is currently on the Superintendent's List and has been on an Academic Honor Roll in each of his six prior semesters.

On the ice Matt has shown an amazing degree of versatility and growth as an athlete. He was an immediate presence on Navy's defensive corps as a plebe because of his size, puck handling skills, and slap shot. After two and a half seasons of playing defense, he was moved to the forward position

in order to fill a void. Even though he had never played forward in any type of organized hockey, he rose to the challenge and netted 24 goals in only 18 games. At the end of the season the accolades began to pour in. He was named Team MVP at the annual team banquet and finished the season as both the leading scorer and the leading goal scorer. He was named an Academic All-American and was selected to the ESCHL 2nd-Team All-League.

## Navy Hockey In Space

Navy Hockey salutes NASA Astronaut Stephen Bowen (Captain, USN) who is scheduled to fly into space aboard the space shuttle Endeavour in November, 2008. Captain Bowen graduated from Cohasset High School, Cohasset, Massachusetts in 1982 and was a stand-out goaltender for the Navy Hockey team from 1982-1986.

Bowen graduated from the United States Naval Academy in 1986 with B.S. in Electrical Engineering and earned a Degree of Ocean Engineering from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1993. Bowen is the first Submarine Officer selected by NASA in July 2000 as a mission specialist.

Upon completion of the submarine training pipeline Bowen spent three years attached to USS PARCHE (SSN 683) and completed qualification in Submarines on USS POGY (SSN 647). After attending the MIT/WHOI Joint program in Ocean Engineering he reported to

USS AUGUSTA (SSN 710) for duty as the Engineering Officer. During this tour he qualified for command of nuclear powered submarines. In 1997 he reported to the United States Special Operations Command (USSOCOM) in the Office of Plans and Policy and worked on the USSOCOM Future Concepts Working Group. For 9 months in 1999 he was the Reactor and Propulsion inspector for the Navy's Submarine Board of Inspection and Survey (INSURV). In May 2000 he became the first Executive Officer of the Pre-Commissioning Unit VIRGINIA (SSN 774) the first of the new VIRGINIA Class submarines.

Captain Bowen reported for training at the Johnson Space Center in August 2000. Following the completion of two years of training and evaluation, he was initially assigned technical duties in the Astronaut Office Station Operations Branch. Bowen is assigned to the crew of STS-126 targeted for launch in November, 2008. Endeavour will carry a

reusable logistics module that will hold supplies and equipment, including additional crew quarters, a second treadmill,



equipment for the regenerative life support system and spare hardware for the International Space Station.

In the lower left corner of the Navy Hockey homepage, found by going to <http://www.usna.edu/hockey> then clicking on the work "Enter," you will find the pictures shown at left. A couple of years ago Navy joined Teamline to begin webcasting an audio version of their games. I had just left the team after two years as the Officer Representative, and was stationed in Italy. My family and I thought this was a timely and very welcome advancement as we were going through hockey withdrawal in southern Europe. We would gather around the computer to listen to the games into the wee hours of the morning (a Saturday evening Annapolis game beginning about 1 a.m. Sunday for us) so we could follow the exploits of the Midshipmen, especially since we knew most of the team personally. It couldn't get any better than that!



Well yes it can. This year, thanks to the generosity of Dr. and Mrs. Wheeler of Newport Beach, California, parents of #13 Jonathan Wheeler, **the webcast of the games will include VIDEO**. I know that our fans spread across the U.S. will benefit from this tremendously, and we can't thank the Wheelers enough. Even those of us living within the Capital beltway here in DC will enjoy it, because attempting to cross the Woodrow Wilson or 14th Street bridge to get to Annapolis on a Friday night can be a trying and very time consuming event.

While all the games played at the McMullen Ice Arena at USNA are planned to be webcast with audio and video it may be that for some away games only audio will be available. Rich Moesch, a long time Navy Hockey supporter who was our trainer while on active duty and also since retiring from the Navy, will do the play-by-play. Don Preul will provide the color commentary.

To access the webcast simply go to the link on the homepage and click on the "Teamline Click to Listen" picture as shown above. I recommend you do this in advance of the game to ensure your computer is ready to go when the puck is dropped.

# Horner Named NAAA Male Club Sport Athlete of the Year

27May08 - Navy hockey's Donnie Horner ('08) was recently named the NAAA male club sport athlete of the year during a graduation awards ceremony in Alumni Hall. A four year letterwinner, the 6'3", 200-lb. senior defenseman also served as president of the Navy hockey team.

This accolade is the latest in a host of post season awards earned by Ensign Horner. Earlier the American College Hockey Association (ACHA) named Horner to the ACHA- Division-1 All-Star Team, which showcased 40 of the top Division-1 players in the country. The inaugural All-Star Game took place at the Penn State Ice Pavilion in University Park, PA on Saturday, March 29th. Horner was one of only 12 college hockey defensemen selected. Horner was also co-recipient of the Eastern States Col-

legiate Hockey League (ESCHL) Sportsmanship Award and was named 2nd Team All-League. The State College, PA native accumulated just eight penalty minutes while playing in all of Navy's 39 games. He amassed a gaudy plus/minus rating of "+31" to lead the Midshipmen, while scoring 7 goals and assisting on 16 others. During his Naval Academy career, Horner accumulated 17 goals and 31 assists for 48 points in 98 games.

"Donnie Horner represents everything that is great about Navy hockey and the Academy," said Head Coach Michael Fox. "It is not coincidental that Donnie's tenure as a 4-year letterwinner coincides with the best four years in Navy Hockey history, to include 4-straight winning seasons

and back-to-back 20-win seasons for the first time ever," Fox added. Over his career, Horner helped his Naval Academy Class of 2008 become the winningest class in the history of Navy Hockey, accumulating 76 total victories.

Horner was also a stand-out in the classroom. He earned a 3.01 cumulative GPA and a 3.80 GPA in his political science major. He was awarded the Dr. Charles H. Coates Award for excellence in military sociology as the Midshipman whose performance most demonstrated the potential to embrace and understand sociology as it serves the Naval Service and Nation. Commissioned as a Surface Warfare Officer, Horner reported for duty aboard the USS Bonhomme Richard in San Diego, California this past June.


