Navy Aiming For Return to ECHA Finals, Possible Shot at National Tournament in Ohio

Navy's ice hockey team enters the 2006-07 season with high hopes and a couple of question marks at key positions, questions that should be answered fairly early in a challenging season that will see the Midshipmen play all of their games before the winter holiday break on the road. That scheduling oddity is the result of the conversion of Dahlgren Hall from an ice rink to a dining hall, combined with the construction of a spanking new McMullen Rink -- which will sit directly opposite the U.S. Naval Academy golf course on Stansbury Point Road -- that won't be completed until December 2006.

When it's done, McMullen Rink will be home for the Mids for years to come, starting with the inaugural contest on Friday, January 5, 2007 against the University of Delaware Blue Hens. By the time the puck is dropped for the opening face-off that evening, Navy will already have 15 games under its belt, so eighth-year coach Rick Randazzo and his assistants should know whether another run at an Eastern Collegiate Hockey Association (ECHA) championship, and a possible spot in the national finals, are still in the cards.

"With the talent I see on this year's team, we're capable of winning the ECHA championship and going to the nationals," said coach Randazzo. "But we have to play full-out hockey for 60 minutes every game to realize our potential. We're not the type of team that can step on the ice and win just because we're wearing Navy uniforms. We need a 110% effort from our guys every single game to be successful. With the senior leadership we have this year, I'm confident our fans will see that level of effort from us."

The major reason fueling optimism entering the 2006-07 campaign is the fact that Navy returns practically everyone from last year's squad that nearly captured the ECHA crown before being upset by Drexel in the championship finals. Only forward and inspirational leader Bill Knips, all-star defenseman Sam Kunst, and standout goaltender Ryan Dobie are missing from this year's roster.

At the top of the list of returnees are senior forwards **Kevin Krmpotich** and **Patrick Sullivan**, who finished #1 and #2, respectively, atop the team's scoring leaders last season. Krmpotich's 17 goals and 31 points were tops for the Mids, while Sullivan's 12 tallies and 30 points made him a close second. Both are capable of putting the puck in the net in key situations and winning games with their offensive skills.

Krmpotich and Sullivan will be joined on Navy's top forward lines by fellow senior and team captain **Jay Alspach** (14 goals a year ago), and junior **Nick Schwob** (12 goals and 8 assists in 11 games in the second half last season). If Alspach can produce double-digit goal totals again, and Schwob can match his 20-points-in-11-games scoring pace from last season, the Mids will be making a lot of enemy goaltenders miserable this season.

Also expected to be among the squad's scoring leaders and defensive specialists on the forward lines are juniors **Brian Gleason** (6 goals, 5 assists last year), **Andrew Stoner** (4 goals, 4 assists), **Derek Johnson**, and **Eric Smitley**; plus a talented group of sophomores which include **Nolan Anliker** (13 goals and 10 assists), **Charlie Daniel** (7 goals, 10 assists), **Jeff Martin**, **Jon Westerman**, **Alex Wallis**, **Charlie Hymen**, **Zach Williamson**, and **Aaron Erzinger**. Of that group, only Wallis did not play for Navy a year ago, but he is talented enough to crack the lineup early in the current campaign.

Coming out of the pre-season tryouts, a trio of freshmen forwards was expected to make the club and see significant playing time at times during the season. That group includes **Nick Hinkley** (Orlando, Florida), **Keegan Kinkade** (Indianapolis, Indiana), and **Calen Mims** (Albuquerque, New Mexico). From that trio, Hinkley should see the most action and fit neatly into one of Navy's top forward lines.

Defensively, the Mids are sitting pretty thanks to a bevy of backliners that include senior assistant team captains **Joe Liles** and **Alex Sandroni**, classmates **Jim Doherty** and much-improved **Adam Sheppard**, plus juniors **Donnie Horner** and **Adam Shields** and sophomores **Matthew Gross** and **Matt Swezey**. All four firsties are rock solid in their own defensive zone and know how to get the puck up to the forwards. They will anchor the defense and load lots of ice time, but their underclass counterparts will play key roles, as well.


Also expected to make significant contributions on the defensive side of the ice this season are freshmen **Patrick Heitman** (Imperial, Missouri), **Chandler Brewer** (Darien, Connecticut), and **Andrew Ochalek** (Milan, Michigan). Of that incoming plebe trio, Heitman is expected to have the best chance of breaking into the list of top six or seven defensemen that the coaches will dress for games.

If there is a question mark for the Mids entering the new campaign, it sits squarely between the two red goalposts that last year were so capably covered by Ryan Dobie. Junior **Sean Ublacker** (2.43 goals against average and .898 save percentage last season) will be given a shot at the starting spot, but he'll be seriously challenged by incoming freshman **Eric Anderson**. Although it's a bit unusual in the Navy system for a plebe to earn a starting nod in the nets, Anderson has both the credentials and quickness to break that trend. If he impresses early, it could mark the beginning of an outstanding four-year career for the Sartell, Minnesota native.

Fellow freshman **Jeremy Estevez** (Grand Rapids, Michigan) should also make the squad and also see some time between the pipes this season.

All in all, the combination of experience, youth, speed, quickness, grit, toughness, and senior leadership should make the Midshipmen one of the teams to beat in the ECHA. With some early season road victories against the schedule's top teams -- including West Chester, Penn State, West Virginia, Rhode Island, Washington & Jefferson, and Delaware -- Navy's coaches just might be booking hotel rooms in March in Youngstown, Ohio, site of this year's American Collegiate Hockey Association's national tournament.

And wouldn't a championship banner or two look mighty nice hanging inside the new McMullen Rink come springtime?















Rick Randazzo, Head Coach
Buffalo, New York
U.S. Military Academy (Class of '93)

Rick Randazzo enters his eighth season as Head Coach of the Naval Academy's hockey team. Last season, the likeable United States Military Academy (USMA) grad reached a major career milestone. Rick and his teams, achieved the 100-win mark against Villanova on October 23, 2005. With a six-year win-loss record of 112-99-12, he previously surpassed Steve Gordon (92 wins in seven seasons) as the

winningest coach in Navy Hockey history.

A four-year letter winner and leading scorer with Army's NCAA Division I hockey team from 1989 to 1993, Rick successfully spearheaded the drive to bring the NCAA's Frozen Four ice hockey post-season tournament to Washington, D.C.'s MCI Center in April 2009. The Naval Academy will be the official host team for this prestigious national showcase event.

Rick was selected to be an assistant coach for Team USA in the Winter World University Games that were held in Innsbruck, Austria in January 2005. The USA team beat the Ukraine, 4-2, in its final game of the 2005 Winter World University Games to finish in ninth place with a 3-3-0 record. Since returning to the Games in 2001 with players from the American Collegiate Hockey Association, Team USA had recorded only one win in the 2001 and 2003 tournaments combined.

Although he is still listed among Army's all-time leading scorers, Rick has instituted a philosophy with the Midshipmen that stresses aggressive team defense, which includes the goaltenders, defensemen, and back-checking forwards. It was Navy's strong defense that propelled the Midshipmen to back-to-back Crabpot Tournament championships in 2001-02 and 2002-03. And it's goaltending and defense that will get the job done again for the Midshipmen this season, Navy's head coach believes.

Rick, who is 35, graduated from West Point in 1993 and served six years in the U.S. Army as an Armor and Cavalry officer. He is both Airborne and Ranger qualified, and has earned the Meritorious Service Medal for his outstanding service to the Army. Rick also holds a Masters degree in Business from Southern Illinois University. He is currently the Vice President of Sales and Business Development for Maxamine, a worldwide web site analytics software firm.

Rick is married to the former Shannan Sterling. The Randazzos and their four children live in Chesapeake Beach, Maryland.

NAVY Hockey 2005-2006 Season Wrap-up

If ever a movie was made or a book was written about the Navy ice hockey team's 2005-06 season, picking a title would be easy. "We Belong" most aptly describes the feeling the Midshipmen had as they brought last season to a close in the finals of the Eastern Collegiate Hockey Association (ECHA) playoffs. In what would be the next-to-last college hockey game ever played in historic Dahlgren Hall, Navy fell to Drexel in the ECHA championship game, 6-4.



In 2006, we said goodbye to the ice at Dahlgren Hall, home of NAVY Hockey from 1971 to 2006.

While the loss was disappointing, the Mids proved to everyone that they could hold their own against any team in their league, and were probably just a few goals and a few wins shy of qualifying for a trip to the national tournament held last March in nearby West Chester, PA.


Last year's journey began with a five-game winning streak to start the season, as Navy opened with victories against Atlantic Coast Conference foes Maryland and Virginia, followed by ECHA league wins over Lehigh, West Virginia, and Drexel. The streak came to an abrupt halt in October at Drexel's Class of '23 rink as the Mids wasted a Patrick Sullivan goal with one second left in regulation by falling to the Dragons, 4-3, in sudden death overtime.

Navy bounced back from the Drexel defeat with a hard-fought 1-0 victory at Villanova, a triumph that gave head coach Rick Randazzo his 100th career victory at USNA. Kevin Krmpotich notched the game's lone goal, and goaltender Sean Ublacker made 25 saves to preserve the win. The Mids then split their next eight games, going 4-4, with the most impressive wins in that stretch coming over Towson in Baltimore, 6-1, and over St. Louis University at Dahlgren Hall, 8-0.

Unfortunately, the very next night after blanking SLU, Navy fell to the Billikens by a 5-2 margin – a disappointing defeat that launched an equally disappointing five-game losing streak that included back-to-back losses at the University of Oklahoma in Norman, 6-3 and 5-3. And although the Mids dropped a pair of ECHA games to the University of Rhode Island (URI) in the middle of that losing streak, it was HOW Navy lost that gave them optimism.

Against the ECHA's top team, which had defeated Navy by lopsided scores of 9-0 and 6-0 in 2004-05, the Mids gave the Rams all they could handle...and more. In the first clash between the two teams, Navy and URI ended regulation time knotted at 2-2 thanks to Nick Schwob and Joe Liles tallies. The Rams picked up a goal with just 21 seconds left in the overtime session to win, 3-2. The next day, the Mids once again showed they belonged against the ECHA's elite, leading 2-0 on a pair of Jack Culliton goals before falling behind 4-2 and eventually succumbing to URI, 4-3.

Although those two tough, heartbreaking losses might have sent some teams packing it in, for the 2005-06 Navy squad, they had exactly the opposite effect. After returning from Norman,

Oklahoma, the Mids reeled off six wins in their next eight games, including an amazing 2-1 overtime triumph at West Virginia, a 6-5 come-from-behind thriller at Scranton (after being down 5-1 after two periods), and impressive wins over Villanova and Robert Morris to earn Navy the prestigious Crabpot Tournament championship. In the championship finale, Jon Westerman scored with just 43 seconds left in regulation time to give the Mids the Crabpot crown.

A pair of lopsided, late season victories over Rutgers set the stage for the ECHA playoffs. With Navy hosting the post-season competition at Dahlgren Hall, the Mids broke a 2-2 second period tie en route to a 7-2 triumph over Scranton in the first round. The next night, Navy played perhaps its best game of the season in blanking West Chester, 3-0, thus avenging a pair of regular season losses to the Golden Rams and putting the Mids in the ECHA championship against surprising Drexel. Drexel earned its way to the big dance with a 2-1 overtime victory over West Virginia and a shocking 2-1 win over favored Rhode Island.

With momentum on their side, the Dragons just had too much for the Mids that Sunday afternoon, overcoming a 3-1 Navy advantage with four consecutive, unanswered goals en route to the 6-4 victory and with it, the ECHA championship.




Seven Midshipmen qualified to play in the first ever ECHA All-Star Game one week later: graduating seniors Ryan Dobie, Sam Kunst, and Bill Knips; plus 2006-07 returnees Schwob, Jay Alspach, Alex Sandroni, and Nolan Anliker. Head coach Randazzo teamed with Lehigh's Mike Lichtenberger to coach the victorious blue squad.

Thanks to the Crabpot Tournament championship, the closely contested URI battles, and their excellent showing in the ECHA playoffs, the Midshipmen sent a clear message to the rest of the league heading into the 2006-07 campaign: Navy belongs, and will be a team to be reckoned with come playoff time again this February and March.

The Friends of Navy Hockey (FNH)



As the Navy Hockey team started its play informally on an Annapolis area pond in the late 1960's, so FNH began in the early 1990's as an informal support organization of former hockey-playing alumni giving freely of their time to support the team. That effort has now evolved into today's alumni-led organization which is involved in virtually all aspects of the team's operation and development. These contributions range from fundraising, which has now moved under the auspices of the Naval Academy Foundation, to equipment and uniform purchases, specialty coaching, informal recruiting, publication of media guide and schedule poster annually, the trophy case displaying Navy Hockey's heritage, action artwork, and other projects as directed by the coaching staff and Officer Representative.

Every year in February (February 24/25, 2007) the still active players in FNH are joined by former A Team graduates from around the world for a weekend of boisterous, competitive hockey against the current Navy Hockey team and then, on the following day, in an odd-even class competition amongst themselves. The Alumni Game is in essence a tribute to Navy Hockey from the Long Blue Line of hockey graduates from 1966 to 2006, and a chance to measure the current team in the only environment where it truly counts – in battle on the ice.

The goal of FNH is to help Navy Hockey become the best collegiate hockey program possible and assist where appropriate as the team evolves from a club sport to more competitive varsity and NCAA arenas. Its long term objective is to lobby quietly but relentlessly for the program to go NCAA Division 1 when Academy officials and the NAAA are ready to take such a decision, and when sufficient resources are made available to support an upgraded program. Hockey is a true warrior sport long played at the NCAA level by Navy's sister service academies. The burgeoning growth of youth hockey programs throughout the country, a trend which does not go unnoticed by other leading colleges and universities, suggests that an upgraded competitive hockey program at the Naval Academy would reap more of the talented and brightest as they reach college age and want a forum for their hockey talents, followed by a career in which skills learned on the ice – intense team play, quick decisions, a total commitment to victory – are directly applicable to the warfare specialties of today's USN and USMC officers.
