The United States Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland, invites nominations and applications for the position of Academic Dean and Provost. The Dean is the chief academic officer of the Naval Academy and reports directly to the Superintendent. The Dean provides institutional leadership in all areas including: development of academic programs; recruitment, retention and development of faculty; articulation of resource requirements; and strategic planning and assessment.

A highly selective undergraduate institution with a diverse student body of 4300, the Naval Academy is dedicated to developing young men and women into career Navy and Marine Corps officers. Graduates must successfully complete a rigorous academic curriculum as well as a demanding athletic and military training program leading to a military commission. The course of study is required by law to be completed in four years and results in a Bachelor of Science degree, regardless of major selection. There is no graduate school at the Naval Academy. The Academy offers nationally accredited undergraduate majors in 22 academic disciplines: eight in engineering, eight in science and six in the humanities and social sciences area. Approximately 65 percent of the students major in engineering, mathematics or science. The 520 full-time faculty members include an approximately equal proportion of career civilian and active duty military personnel. Competitive candidates will have distinguished records of academic achievement and proven administrative skills. Candidates must have an earned doctorate, preferably with a record of teaching and research sufficient to qualify for the rank of professor and in a discipline offered by the Naval Academy.

The preferred start date for the successful candidate is **July 1, 2009**. An initial four-year contract will include federal benefits and compensation commensurate with experience. Applications will be reviewed as received until the position is filled. For maximum consideration, applications should be received by **September 30, 2008**.
