 Great moments and heroes in American Navy and Marine Corps history are represented throughout the Yard in statues, paintings, ship models and artifacts. The Naval Academy is accessible through the Gate 1 pedestrian gate, on Prince George Street. Visitors 16 and older must show a photo ID. Once on the Yard, proceed to the Visitor Center. 1 Arnold Levine Visitor Center
 The center, located on the seaward side of Ellzey Field House, features the official Naval Academy gift shop, a bookstore, a cafe, a museum, a theater, a gallery, a library, a museum, a gift shop, and the Naval Academy Gift Shop.

2 Ricketts Hall, NAAU Ticket Office
 The building contains offices of the Naval Academy Athletic Association (NAAA), a variety athletic training complex and football field. Tickets for Navy athletes are sold here.

3 LeMay Physical Education Center
 The Athletic Hall of Fame, an Olympic-size pool and a wrestling arena are located here.

4 Trowbridge Court
 The Indian Visitor Ecomech sands watch over the site of a now-missing Midshipman at 12:00pm weekdays during the academic year unless otherwise announced.

5 Runnells Hall
 The stairs from the rounds lead up to the Runnells Hall, a building dedicated to USNA alumni and those who died in operational activities. Located off the Rounds, the building contains a museum, a sample Midshipman's Room,

6 Main Chapel
 The Main Chapel is a high priory in the Yard with a sweeping view of the Severn River. The Chapel was dedicated in 1908 and conducts services for the community. Beautiful stained glass windows were designed by Tiffany and Gorham Studios.

7 The Corps of John Paul Jones
 One of the greatest Revolutionary War naval heroes, Jones is enshrined beneath the Chapel. His remains, which were recovered from the wreck of the ship, are housed in a Pavilion in the rear of the Chapel.

8 U.S. Naval Academy Museum, Potts Hall
 When the Museum reopened in fall 2009, it will contain historic treasures including paintings, prints and artifacts depicting naval history. The Class of 1951 Gallery of Ships and Ship Models will be a new feature and will display the 17th century to modern times.

9 LeMay Hall
 The office of admission is open to candidates interested in applying to the academy. Pick up a copy of USNA, Tridents weekly newspaper, which is available at the Visitor Center and Dahlgren Hall.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

The following regulations regarding Plebe Summer and the first semester of Plebe Year are provided for your information and advanced planning:

1. During Plebe Summer, midshipmen are unavailable for visiting. This includes during chapel services. Exceptions can be made for emergencies; contact your midshipman's Company Officer.
2. The mailing of "care packages" to Midshipmen Fourth Class is encouraged. However, the items should be single-serving, nonperishable, and able to fit in a shipping container no larger than a shoe box to facilitate storage and handling. All food should be sent in air-tight containers. Packages must be sent via mail; no packages will be accepted at Main Office for delivery to midshipmen.
3. Midshipmen Fourth Class are required to sit with the Brigade of Midshipmen during home football games. Please do not purchase tickets for them.
4. During the academic year, Midshipmen Fourth Class are normally authorized town liberty on Saturday afternoons and evenings.
5. Any Midshipman Fourth Class who requests a sponsor will be assigned one during Plebe Summer. Sponsors are local families who volunteer to provide a "home away from home" for midshipmen.
6. Per Midshipmen Regulations, no Midshipmen Fourth Class (regardless of age) are permitted to drink alcoholic beverages unless they are on authorized leave from the Naval Academy.
7. The Army-Navy Football game is currently scheduled for Saturday, Dec. 10, 2011 at FedEx Field in Landover, Maryland. Midshipmen Fourth Class will be bused back to the academy following completion of the game.
8. Thanksgiving and Christmas are leave periods. Only those midshipmen who have lost leave as a result of conduct offenses or physical education deficiency will be required to remain at the academy. Those who are professionally or academically deficient and appearing before the Academic or Advisory Board may be required to return early from Christmas leave. Military duties and obligations frequently change. **It is the responsibility of your son or daughter to ensure the dates and times of leave periods are correct and approved by their chain of command prior to buying a plane ticket.** Anticipated commencement and expiration dates for these leave periods are as follows:

DAHLGREN HALL/DRYDOCK RESTAURANT

The Drydock Restaurant in Dahlgren Hall will serve breakfast from 7 a.m. until 10 a.m. Fresh baked bagels, breakfast sandwiches, and other assorted breakfast items, to include some "grab-n-go."

Lunch and dinner will be served from 10 a.m. until 9 p.m. Selections include: sandwiches, salads, pizza, hamburgers, hot dogs, subs and much more. Ice cream, cookies, sodas, iced tea and juices are also available.

ARMEL-LEFTWICH VISITOR CENTER

The Armel-Leftwich Visitor Center overlooks Annapolis Harbor and the Chesapeake Bay. It features an information center, a theater with an 18-minute film, audiovisual and interactive exhibits, a vending machine and guide service. The 4,500-square-foot gift shop features Navy, Naval Academy, and Marine Corps issue-ware, souvenirs, prints, books, CDs and videos. Visitor Center profits are used to support the activities of the Brigade of Midshipmen.

The center is open daily from 9 a.m. until 5 p.m. The center is closed Thanksgiving, Christmas, and New Year's Day.

On Induction Day, free guided walking tours will be provided by Visitor Center personnel from 7 a.m. until 9 a.m. originating from Sampson Hall. After 9:30 a.m., departing from the Visitor Center, tours are available for adults at \$9.50; seniors (ages 62+) at \$8.50; and students (K through 12th grades) at \$7.50. THE MIDSHIPMEN STORE

The Midshipmen Store is a retail activity to service the needs of the Brigade of Midshipmen. Located in Bancroft Hall, this activity carries a wide range of items required by Midshipmen in the performance of their duties. Like other college stores, it also carries a complete line of U.S. Naval Academy emblematic items and gifts.

Parents are allowed to shop in the Midshipmen Store using issued Parent/Guardian shopping cards which will be issued at the Midshipmen Store during 4/C Parents' Weekend. Shopping cards expire May 2015.

Parents may also use the "Family Member" stickers mailed earlier with the Midshipmen Store brochure. Store hours for Induction Day are: Thursday, June 30, 2011 from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. All profits from the Midshipmen Store are used to support activities of the Brigade of Midshipmen.
