1. Purpose. To publish the summer uniform period for the Naval Academy; Naval Support Activity Annapolis; and Naval Health Clinic, Annapolis effective 16 April 2012.
2. Cancellation. USNANOTE 1020 of 30 September 2011.
3. Information. Uniforms prescribed apply only to U.S. Navy and Marine Corps personnel. Officers of other services and nations on duty at the Naval Academy or under the area coordination of the Superintendent will wear the corresponding uniform of their service.
 - a. Basic uniform policy is published in references (a) thru (c).
 - b. Uniforms for Midshipmen will be prescribed by the Commandant of Midshipmen.
 - c. Area Commanding Officers/Officers-in-Charge, not designated in paragraph 1 and not under the operational command of the Superintendent, United States Naval Academy, will prescribe uniforms for their personnel consistent with enclosures (1) and (2).
4. Action
 - a. For the period beginning 16 April 2012, summer uniforms are as prescribed in enclosures (1) and (2).
 - b. There will be no transition period.

Leave and Liberty: Appropriate civilian attire is authorized in lieu of the Uniform of the Day. Personnel will ensure their dress and personal appearance is appropriate and will not bring discredit upon the Naval service.

Notes:

- Uniform of the Day with ribbons and name tag will be worn on the Naval Academy grounds for Graduation Week (23-29 May 12), I Day Minus 1 (27 Jun), Induction Day (28 Jun 12), Class of 2016 Parents' Weekend (09-12 Aug 12), and other designated periods as prescribed by the Superintendent. USMC personnel will wear Blue Dress "D" during these periods as directed by the USMC Representative.
- V-neck or Crewneck undershirts will be worn with Summer White, Service Khaki, and Working Khaki uniforms.
- Women may wear skirts as an option to the basic uniform. Navy only: service shoes or pumps may be worn with either skirts or slacks.

4. Alternate workday uniform will not be authorized during specific ceremonial periods.
5. Appropriate working uniforms may be authorized by Commanding Officers, Officers-in-Charge, the USMC Representative, and the Commandant of Midshipmen. Waterfront Readiness personnel may wear working uniforms to/from work. Stops off base in working uniforms are not authorized nor are working uniforms authorized inside the Beltway.
6. Appropriate civilian attire is authorized for Chapel services and athletic events for all officers at their option.
7. Coaches/Physical Education Instructors/Officer Representatives may wear alternate workday uniform as required.
8. For those personnel entitled to wear brown leather flight jackets: For Navy personnel, brown leather flight jackets are authorized to be worn at USNA with Service Khaki. Marine Corps uniform regulations allow the leather flight jacket to be worn with Service "B" or "C". The jacket will not be worn on leave or liberty, or with the Desert MARPAT uniform or civilian clothing. Communication devices are not authorized for wear on any dress or MARPAT uniform.
9. As prescribed in reference (c), the use of portable communication devices (e.g. cell phones, blackberries, pagers, etc) are authorized for use and wear while in uniform (to include walking) in the manner prescribed as follows:
 - a. Communication devices shall be conservative in color and design and shall not distract from the appearance of the uniform.
 - b. Only one communication device is authorized for wear and can only be worn on the belt of working and service uniforms aft of the elbow.
 - c. Wearing of communication devices on service dress is not authorized.
 - d. Communication devices will not be visible from the front and worn in such a manner as not to impede the normal wear and appearance of the uniform (e.g. sagging, bunching, bulging, protruding etc).
 - e. Whenever there is a concern for operational security, the authorized use of communication devices shall be at the commanding officer's discretion.
 - f. The use of portable communication devices shall not interfere with the rendering of military courtesies and honors, nor violate local, state, and federal laws.
 - g. When not being worn on the uniform and in use, communication devices will be placed at the side of the leg and in the appropriate hand when rendering salutes, greetings and other military courtesies/honors.
 - h. The use of an earpiece, blue tooth technology, headsets or hands free device while in uniform indoors or outdoors is prohibited unless specifically authorized for execution of official duties (e.g. NSW, security personnel, detailers, etc).
 - i. The use of blue tooth technology, headsets and other hands free devices are only allowed in uniform in a vehicle when authorized by local, state and federal law.
10. As prescribed in reference (c), female officers and CPOs are authorized to wear the poly/wool khaki overblouse as an optional Service Khaki uniform component in the manner prescribed as follows:
 - a. The poly/wool overblouse is authorized for wear with poly/wool Service Khaki slacks or skirts only.
 - b. The overblouse shall be worn outside the slacks or skirt and shall hang comfortably over the hips and chest without pulling open.

c. When worn with the black relax fit jacket or v-neck sweater, the overblouse will be tucked so that the bottom of the blouse will not protrude beyond the bottom of the jacket or sweater.

d. The length of the overblouse shall be long enough to fall approximately one inch above the bottom of the side pocket opening. All buttons shall be fastened.

e. All ribbons, warfare devices, identification badges and nametags shall be worn as prescribed for the summer white uniform with the exception of placement of ribbons and nametags. Placement of ribbons shall be six and one quarter inches down from the intersection of the front seam and centered over the front seam.

f. Name tags shall be placed in the same manner on the right side of the overblouse.

g. The Khaki overblouse is not authorized for wear with the 100% polyester (CNT) slacks or skirt.

11. Woodland MARPATs are only authorized if the sporting event is held at a military facility (the Navy-Marine Corps Stadium is NOT a military facility). Service "C" or appropriate civilian attire will be worn in place of MARPATs when not at a military facility.

Leave and Liberty: Appropriate civilian attire is authorized in lieu of the Uniform of the Day. Personnel will ensure their dress and personal appearance is appropriate and will not bring discredit upon the Naval service.

Notes:

1. Quarterdeck watches will be stood in the Uniform of the Day (alternate is not authorized).
2. Uniform of the Day with ribbons and name tag will be worn on the Naval Academy grounds for Graduation Week (23-29 May 12), Induction Day (28 Jun 12), Class of 2016 Parents' Weekend (9-12 Aug 12), and other designated periods as prescribed by the Superintendent. USMC personnel will wear Blue Dress "D" during these periods as directed by the USMC Representative.
3. V-neck or Crewneck undershirts will be worn with Summer White, Service Khaki, and Working Khaki uniforms.
4. Working Khaki and Desert MARPAT uniforms may be worn to and from work by all personnel assigned to activities at Waterfront Readiness. Stops off base in working uniforms are not authorized. Working uniforms are not authorized inside the Beltway.
5. On the Naval Academy grounds, Working Khaki and Desert MARPAT uniforms are authorized in work areas and while involved in work details only. This policy generally precludes the wearing of Working Khaki and Desert MARPAT uniforms in the central ceremonial area of the Naval Academy and in areas normally frequented by tourists. The ceremonial area is defined as that portion of the Yard bounded by Bancroft, Chauvenet, Michelson, Maury, Mahan, Sampson and Preble Halls, the Administration Building, Chapel, Buchanan House, and Dahlgren Hall.
6. Clean working uniforms are authorized for wear at the Navy Exchange/Commissary Complex and to/from the Medical/Dental Clinics.
7. Command ball caps are authorized for wear with working uniforms. They are not authorized for wear to and from work.
8. Navy v-neck black pullover sweaters are authorized with the Working Khaki and by all personnel. The sweaters are not authorized for wear off base in public places. The Navy black v-neck pullover is authorized for Service Khakis at all times. Brown pullover sweaters are not authorized under any circumstances. Cardigan sweaters are authorized in immediate work space only.

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9. Navy black jacket with stand up knit collar (CPOs) and Navy black jacket with pointed collar (E-6 and below) are authorized with Summer White, Service Khaki, and working uniforms.
10. Females may wear appropriate pumps or service shoes with either skirts or slacks.
11. Females may wear skirt or slacks at their discretion, unless otherwise designated.
12. The wearing of Desert MARPAT will be per Marine Corps Uniform Regulations and limited to duties which involve physical exertion, dirty environments, or nonpublic activities; designated occasions or events; and other specific grants of permission by the USMC Representative.
13. For those personnel entitled to wear brown leather flight jackets: For Navy personnel, brown leather flight jackets are authorized to be worn at USNA with Service Khaki. Marine Corps uniform regulations allow the leather flight jacket to be worn with Service "C". The jacket will not be worn on leave or liberty, or with the Desert MARPAT uniform or civilian clothing.
14. As prescribed in reference (c), the use of portable communication devices (e.g. cell phones, blackberries, pagers, etc.) are authorized for use and wear while in uniform (to include walking) in the manner prescribed as follows:
 - a. Communication devices shall be conservative in color and design and shall not distract from the appearance of the uniform.
 - b. Only one communication device is authorized for wear and can only be worn on the belt of working and service uniforms aft of the elbow.
 - c. Wearing of communication devices on service dress is not authorized.
 - d. Communication devices will not be visible from the front and worn in such a manner as not to impede the normal wear and appearance of the uniform (e.g. sagging, bunching, bulging, protruding etc.).
 - e. Whenever there is a concern for operational security, the authorized use of communication devices shall be at the commanding officer's discretion.
 - f. The use of portable communication devices shall not interfere with the rendering of military courtesies and honors, nor violate local, state, and federal laws.
 - g. When not being worn on the uniform and in use, communication devices will be placed at the side of the leg and in the appropriate hand when rendering salutes, greetings, and other military courtesies/honors.
 - h. The use of an earpiece, blue tooth technology, headsets, or hands free device while in uniform, indoors or outdoors, is prohibited unless specifically authorized for execution of official duties (e.g. NSW, security personnel, detailers, etc.).
 - i. The use of blue tooth technology, headsets, and other hands free devices are only allowed in uniform in a vehicle when authorized by local, state, and federal law.
15. As prescribed in reference (c), female officers and CPOs are authorized to wear the poly/wool khaki overblouse as an optional Service Khaki uniform component in the manner prescribed as follows:
 - a. The poly/wool overblouse is authorized for wear with poly/wool Service Khaki slacks or skirts only.
 - b. The overblouse shall be worn outside the slacks or skirt and shall hang comfortably over the hips and chest without pulling open.

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c. When worn with the black relax fit jacket or v-neck sweater, the overblouse will be tucked so that the bottom of the blouse will not protrude beyond the bottom of the jacket or sweater.

d. The length of the overblouse shall be long enough to fall approximately one inch above the bottom of the side pocket opening. All buttons shall be fastened.

e. All ribbons, warfare devices, identification badges, and nametags shall be worn as prescribed for the summer white uniform with the exception of placement of ribbons and nametags. Placement of ribbons shall be six and one quarter inches down from the intersection of the front seam and centered over the front seam.

f. Name tags shall be placed in the same manner on the right side of the overblouse.

g. The Khaki overblouse is not authorized for wear with the 100% polyester (CNT) slacks or skirt.
