1. Purpose. To provide guidelines and procedures for the Senior Sailor of the Quarter (SSOQ), Junior Sailor of the Quarter (JSOQ), Bluejacket of the Quarter (BJOQ), Senior Sailor of the Year (SSOY), Junior Sailor of the Year (JSOY), and Bluejacket of the Year (BJOY) Programs.

2. Cancellation. USNA/AACINST 1700.8

3. Discussion. This program was established to recognize superior performance of enlisted personnel with emphasis on outstanding achievements, exemplary personal conduct, military bearing, and demonstrated initiative in the performance of duty.

4. Eligibility. This program is open to all Navy personnel in the paygrades of E-6 and below, including Active Duty, Full Time Support, Active Duty for Special Work, and Navy Reserve inactive duty personnel.

a. Sailors in the paygrade of E-6 will compete for SSOQ and SSOY, paygrades E-4 and E-5 will compete for JSOQ and JSOY, and paygrades E-1 to E-3 will compete for BJOQ and BJOY.

b. Nominees must have at least 90 days onboard to compete for SOQ and nine months for SOY, no record of disciplinary action and/or derogatory counseling during the past six months, must have successfully passed the most recent PFA cycle, and be within Navy height and weight standards.

5. Selection Criteria. The selection criteria should include but not be limited to the following demonstrated traits and qualifications during the nominative period:

- a. Noteworthy achievements that contribute to the mission of the command.
- b. Demonstrated sustained excellence in leadership, military bearing, and personal behavior.
- c. Professional and technical proficiency.
- d. Demonstrated motivation, pride, and patriotism.
- e. Participation in community affairs or off-duty activities that enhance the Navy's image.

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- f. Awards, letters of commendation and/or appreciation, and acts of heroism.
- g. Off-duty education, as well as professional education through Navy schools and correspondence courses.
- h. Personal interview:
 - (1) Appearance
 - (2) Military Bearing
 - (3) Military Knowledge
 - (4) Demeanor/Attitude

6. Responsibilities

- a. Command Master Chief (CMC). Responsible for the successful operation and integrity of this program. The CMC will select a Chief Petty Officer or Senior Chief Petty Officer to act as the SOQ/SOY Coordinator.
- b. SOQ/SOY Coordinator. Responsible for the administration of the program. Duties include, but are not limited to:
 - (1) Solicit nominations and screen all nomination packages for completeness.
 - (2) Arrange a time and place to hold selection boards.
 - (3) Notify board members of meeting time and place.
 - (4) Coordinate recognition and awards ceremony for selected winners with CMC.

7. Nomination Procedures

- a. Nominations from each department will be submitted by the Department LCPO's to the SOQ/SOY Coordinator. The nomination format is provided in enclosures (1), (2), (5), and (6) as applicable.
- b. Nominations for SOQ/JSOQ/BJOQ must be submitted no later than the fifth work day of the month following the last day of the quarter (31 March, 30 June, 30 September, 31 December).
- c. Nominations for SOY/JSOY/BJOY must be submitted no later than 15 January.

8. Selection Boards

- a. The quarterly boards shall convene no later than the third week following the end of the quarter. The date for of the year board will be promulgated by the CMC in December of each year.
- b. The SSOQ/JSOQ/SSOY/JSOY selection boards will consist of Gunnery Sergeants, Chief Petty Officers or Senior Chief Petty Officers. SSOY/JSOY will be chaired by the CMC or his absence, a Master Chief Petty Officer.
- c. The BJOQ/BJOY selection board will consist of First Class Petty Officers from various departments. The BJOQ board will be chaired by the standing SOY (if SOY is unavailable the First Class Petty Officer Association President). The BJOY will be chaired by a Chief or above. The SOQ/SOY Coordinator will provide quality assurance for the board proceedings.
- d. Each board member may ask one or two questions. Questions must be associated with the topics listed in enclosure (3). The same question must be asked of all candidates. Once the board has selected and collectively agreed upon questions, no other questions will be allowed.
- e. Board members will use enclosure (4) to effectively evaluate each nominee.

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f. The Chairperson of each board will be a non-voting member unless a tie-breaker vote is required.

g. The SOQ/SOY Coordinator will submit all results from the Chairpersons to the CMC. CMC will submit selection recommendations to the Superintendent for final approval. Upon approval from the Superintendent, the SOQ/SOY Coordinator will advise departmental LCPO's of the non-selects. The CMC will announce the winners.

9. Recognition

a. Announcements will be made no later than 10 working days after the selection board adjourns.

b. The SSOQ/JSOQ/BJOQ will receive the following:

- (1) Flag Letter of Commendation from the Superintendent, Naval Academy.
- (2) Command Plaque.
- (3) At the discretion of the selectee's command/unit, a one, two, and three day special liberty pass.
- (4) A Command Master Chief's coin for Excellence.

c. The SSOY/JSOY/BJOY will receive the following:

(1) Command Plaque.

(2) Senior. Nominated to compete in the Naval District Washington SOY competition which will include a nomination for a Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal. If not selected at a higher level of competition, nominee will be awarded the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal from the Superintendent, Naval Academy.

(3) Junior. Awarded a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal from the Superintendent, Naval Academy.

(4) Bluejacket. Awarded a Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal from the Superintendent, Naval Academy.

(5) Winners will also receive, at the discretion of the selectee's command/unit, a one, two, and three day special liberty pass and a Superintendent's coin for Excellence.

10. Action. Competition will take place quarterly and annually. All departments will adhere to the following guidance:

- a. Implement procedures for screening and nominating candidates for this program.
- b. Forward nomination packages to the SOQ/SOY Coordinator.

11. Review Responsibility. The SOQ/SOY Coordinator, in cooperation with the CMC, is responsible for reviewing this instruction annually.
