THE ACADEMIC PROGRAM begins with a core curriculum that includes courses in engineering, science, mathematics and the humanities.

All graduates receive a Bachelor's of Science degree and are commissioned as officers in the Navy or Marine Corps.

The Naval Academy provides an excellent learning environment with a student to faculty ratio of 8:1. The faculty is comprised of an equal mix of civilian and military professors. All civilian professors hold a doctorate degree where military faculty members hold at least a Master's.





MEET THE BASIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- U.S. citizen of good moral character
- 17 but not older than 23 on Induction Day
- Unmarried
- Not pregnant
- No legal obligation to support a child or other dependents

QUALIFY PHYSICALLY

All candidates must pass a standard Candidate Fitness Assessment (CFA)

- Coordination
- Strength
- Speed
- Agility

QUALIFY ACADEMICALLY

Academic information to be evaluated:

- High school / college transcript
- Official test scores
- Extracurricular activities
- Athletics
- Four years of math
- Four years of English
- One year of history, chemistry, physics
- Two years of modern foreign language highly recommended

QUALIFY MEDICALLY

All candidates are required to have a medical examination:

- Conditions may be identified which could either be aggravated by our rigorous program or restrict military service after graduation
- Visual acuity: 20/40, correctable to 20/20
- Waivers will automatically be considered for highly qualified candidates

OBTAIN A NOMINATION

Candidates should apply to all sources for which they are eligible. Nominations must be obtained from an official source.

- U.S. Senators and Representatives
- Delegate from the District of Columbia
- Governor and/or resident Commissioner of Puerto Rico
- The President
- The Vice President
- Resident Representative from the Commonwealth of the Northern Marianas Islands
- Delegates to Congress of Guam, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa
- Regular and Reserve Navy and Marine Corps
- Naval JROTC or other JROTC honor unit
- NROTC (Naval Reserve Officer's Training Corps
- Children of deceased/disabled Veterans
- Children of POWs/MIAs
- Children of Medal of Honor Recipients

TUITION


All Midshipmen receive a full four-year scholarship with:
