



CHILDCARE OPTIONS FOR NAVY CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES

▶ Potential Fee Subsidy – Military Childcare in Your Neighborhood (MCCYN)

For full time childcare and before/after school programs, the most secure option is the Military Childcare in Your Neighborhood (MCCYN) program. It provides a subsidy that lowers the cost of a qualified in-town civilian child care provider to about \$840/child/month or lower.

To use, you will need to identify a local childcare center that meets certain requirements, which are detailed on MilitaryChildCare.com. Waitlists for many centers can be as long as two years, so do your research on local options as soon as you can and apply early. You will need to separately apply for the MCCYN program, which has its own waitlist of 1-5 months. To start the fee assistance, you will need to be within 30 days of starting at an approved childcare center, so be prepared to pay the full cost for a few months.

Apply for the MCCYN fee assistance at MilitaryChildCare.com. When requesting care, make sure to scroll to the bottom of the provider listings to select this option.

▶ Potential Full-time Care – NSAA Child Development Centers (CDCs)

Full-time care is also available at the NSAA Child Development Centers (CDCs). However, civilian families can be supplanted on 45 days notice at any time to make room for Active Duty families. If you choose to use this option, it costs about \$840/child/month or less and the waitlist can be a year or longer. Apply at MilitaryChildCare.com.

▶ Hourly Care – NSAA Child Development Centers (CDCs)

Hourly care is available at the NSAA CDCs for \$8/child/hour. It can be used for a maximum of 25 hours per week and space is limited. Reservations can be made 30 days in advance through the Navy CYP website. Contact the center at (410) 293-9390 to register.
