Lieutenant Commander Joel Borrelli-Boudreau, from Methuen, Massachusetts, holds the following degrees: Bachelor of Music from the New England Conservatory of Music, Master of Music from the University of Miami, Master of Arts in conducting from George Mason University, Doctor of Musical Arts in orchestral conducting from the Catholic University of America, and a Graduate Performance Diploma from the Peabody Conservatory. In addition, he earned 77 Doctor of Musical Arts credits from the Cincinnati College-Conservatory of Music.

After enlisting in the Navy in 1997, he was selected for assignment to the Naval Academy Band. In September

of 2010, he was promoted to the rank of Chief Petty Officer, and subsequently received his commission in October 2012. During his first officer tour, he served as Director, Navy Band Fleet Support Unit & Training Support Officer at the Naval School of Music. In November of 2014, he was assigned as Assistant Director, U.S. Naval Forces Europe Band. Beginning in May of 2017, he served as the Director of Navy Band Northeast, and in July of 2020, he was assigned to the Navy Office of Community Outreach (NAVCO), where he served as a Lead Planner for the "Navy Week" National Outreach Program. He reported as Director, Naval Academy Band in March 2023.

Master Chief Musician Todd Nix, Senior Enlisted Leader



Master Chief Musician Todd Nix is a native of Grants Pass, Oregon and a 1988 graduate of Grants Pass High School. He received a Bachelor of Music from the University of Oregon, and completed a Master of Music in Tuba Performance at Indiana University, where he was a graduate assistant. His principal teachers include Harvey Phillips, Daniel Perantoni, Richard Frazier, and Floyd Cooley.

Prior to joining the Navy, Nix performed frequently in Oregon with the Eugene Symphony Orchestra and Eugene Opera Company, and served as Adjunct Professor of Music at Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana. He has been recognized nationally for

his ensemble work at both the Fischoff National Chamber Music Festival and the NY Brass Conference and was awarded second place in the Mock Orchestral Audition Competition held at the International Tuba-Euphonium Conference in 1995.

In 1997 Nix auditioned and was assigned for duty with the United States Naval Academy Band. He performs as tuba instrumentalist with the marching band and ceremonial units and serves as the Naval Academy Band's Senior Enlisted Leader.

WINNER: Perry's Ferry by Spencer Merk



Spencer Merk is a trombonist, composer, and arranger located in Baltimore, Maryland. He has had the pleasure of performing professionally with world-class musicians such as Jeff Hamilton, Maria Schneider, Umphrey's McGee, Jeff Coffin, Kurt Elling, Charlie Hunter, Kim Deal (The Pixies, The Breeders), Mike Gordon (Phish), and many others. His compositions and arrangements have been performed by Umphrey's McGee (featuring Jeff Coffin), Warren Wolf, Mike Gordon, Walfredo Reyes Jr., the Cincinnati Contemporary Jazz Orchestra, the University of Dayton Jazz Band, The Peabody Jazz Ensemble, and the Peabody Pan-American Jazz Ensemble. He has released two albums on Golden Mean Records: "Last Place in a Bear Race" (2022) and "At Least" (The Merk Brothers, 2023). In 2022, Spencer won the International Trombone Association's J.J. Johnson Competition for Jazz trombonists under the age of 25. He is currently a first-year Graduate Jazz Fellow at the Peabody Institute of Johns Hopkins University.
